### **1. Will you commit to supporting the implementation of a National Strategy on Brain Injury, given that it has already received unanimous support in House of Commons and adopted by the Standing Committee on Health?**

*Why this matters:* Brain injury affects millions of Canadians yet remains underfunded and overlooked in healthcare policy. This question ensures candidates acknowledge prior parliamentary support and commit to action.

### **2. How will you ensure stable federal funding for brain injury prevention, research, and allocation of federal funding to provinces and territories to improve support services, including those addressing the intersections with mental health, addiction, and intimate partner violence?**

*Why this matters:* Sustainable funding is critical to prevent brain injuries and support affected individuals. This question highlights the need for long-term investment in services that reflect the complex challenges of brain injury.

### **3. If elected, how will you prioritize brain injury within federal healthcare and social policy to ensure survivors receive equitable access to care and resources?**

*Why this matters:* Many individuals with brain injuries struggle to access proper care, rehabilitation, and support. This question pushes candidates to consider brain injury within broader health, disability, and social policies.
